Pre-Phonics Webinars

During the Spring and Summer Term this year, Southampton Inclusion Partnership ran a series of three webinars designed to develop staff knowledge of how to support learners who are not ready for formal phonics.

The webinars were attended by 24 schools from Southampton, as well as schools from Suffolk, Middlesex, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Kent, Surrey and Hampshire.

Feedback from the series was overwhelmingly complimentary. Comments from participants included...

Whole School SEND deliver the Universal SEND Services programme, a freely available training offer, funded by the DfE and in partnership with the Education and Training Foundation.

Whole School SEND Professional Development Groups

We are pleased to announce that Southampton have been selected for fully funded online support in the form of a professional development group. The programme aims to support school improvement in relation to SEND, this year with a specific focus on improving provision for learners with communication and interaction needs.

Three online meetings (3 x 2 hours) will be underpinned by developing a secure knowledge of the Education Endowment's Implementation Cycle framework. Participants will identify an area of school improvement related to SEND and work collaboratively with the group to explore, plan, deliver and evaluate school improvement within their own settings.

Experienced facilitators will support participants to identify and refine a focus for their school project before embarking on the delivery phase. This will be supplemented by optional coaching sessions on line. Dates have been agreed as follows:

- Thurs 9th October 2025, 1.30 pm to 3.00 pm (online)
- Thurs 4th December 2025, 1.30 pm to 3.00 pm (online)
- Thurs 5th February 2026, 1.30 pm to 3.00 pm (online)

Where possible, participants are invited to attend in pairs so that they can work together on a key project, build a school approach to distributed leadership and secure sustainability of project outcomes e.g. SENCo attending alongside Teaching and Learning Lead.

A minimum of 15 participants is required for this programme to go ahead.





SEMH Transition Project Update

As you are aware, **Southampton Inclusion Partnership** was allocated funding, through the Delivering Better Value Grant, to support schools in improving Yr 6 to 7 transition. This support was specifically targeted at pupils with SEMH needs who may find transitioning to secondary school challenging.

The overall aim of the project was to improve transition for these children/young people, reducing the risk of exclusion and poor attendance, resulting in a successful secondary education and preparation for adulthood. Supported by The Polygon School, the project focused on partnership working between primary and secondary schools and is another example of the collaborative work that is in evidence across the city.

Cocial, Emotional & Mental Health Programme

Recommendations from the report are summarised below:

Primary	Secondary
Share early information about pupils who may face challenges.	Prioritise meetings with primary schools, pupils and parents.
Invite secondary staff to EHCP reviews for collaborative target setting.	Share a clear menu of interventions and support options.
Recognise and communicate pupils' underlying needs.	Actively listen to primary insights and pupil/parent perspectives.
Include pupil and parent voice in the transition process.	Share preparatory materials early e.g. social stories.
Provide detailed pupil profiles covering provision, interventions, attendance, and relationships.	Avoid rigid approaches; offer fresh starts and personalised plans.
Ensure transition documents address all four areas of need.	Use holistic assessments beyond academic data.
Gradually reduce pupil support to build independence and self-esteem.	Define and communicate support options clearly.
Provide modelled timetables and review interventions regularly.	Offer pre-transition activities like after-school clubs.
Visit secondary schools to understand their resources and expectations.	Focus on building trust with all new pupils, including those from alternative provisions.
Use these insights to better prepare pupils for transition.	Align behaviour policies with agreed adjustments for individual pupils.
	Involve external agencies early to enhance transition planning.

School SEND Spotlight



Our new feature, **SEND Spotlight**, shines a light on and celebrates some of the good SEND practice taking place across the city.

Over the last year **Oasis Academy Mayfield** have implemented Zones of Regulation groups to support pupils with SEND to understand their emotions and determine what they need in order to regulate during the school day.

The 4 week programme of support has been developed using the Zones of Regulation guidance and has been a collaborative project between school staff and Southampton Inclusion Partnership. The school have also introduced Regulation Stations that identified pupils can access using a regulation exit card. The regulation stations contain a variety of activities, tools, sensory resources and personalised items that the pupils have chosen to help them regulate. Pupils use timers to help them manage their time at the regulation station before returning to class when calm. Adult check ins are also available when needed.

This approach has had a positive impact on pupil regulation through pupils and teachers having a common language and shared understanding of emotions. The team have also been able to track patterns of dysregulation in order for curriculum leads to provide additional support and coaching to teachers where needed. Great work Molly and all the team at Oasis Mayfield.

Become a teacher and specialise in SEND. Our PGCE Primary SEND route could be for you!

Join us on an 'outstanding' teacher training programme and become one of our sought after graduates. Taught by experts, our PGCE Primary – specialising in SEND route fully equips you for your first year of teaching and beyond.

Working with our passionate tutors and your student peers provides you with the knowledge, understanding and skills you need to become autonomous, innovative, research-informed teachers able to flourish in a changing environment. On this programme you will learn to teach across the whole primary age-range whilst having the opportunity to specialise in SEND.

This route is an exciting joint venture between the University of Winchester and the Southampton Inclusion Partnership who provide SEND support and training to schools across Southampton and beyond.

Other specialist routes include PGCE Primary 3-7 years, PGCE Primary with Mathematics and PGCE Primary Physical Education.



ON THE PGCE PRIMARY SEND ROUTE YOU WILL:

- Undertake a placement in two different schools, one in primary mainstream and the other in a special needs school.
- Attend university-based training with the PGCE Primary cohort with a focus on the whole primary age-range with modules covering: child development, developing your teacher identity and effective pedagogy; subject knowledge and inclusion and diversity.
- Have regular sessions with your SEND specialism colleagues to deepen your understanding of SEND, knowledge of SEND strategies and adaptive teaching and assessment. These sessions will be led by guest lecturers from local special and mainstream schools.
- Engage in debates about current issues and be responsive to changes in policy and educational contexts.
- Work in partnership with University tutors and a mentor within your school who will support you every step of the way.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED:

- Grade C/4 GCSE (or equivalent) in maths, a science, and English language or literature.
- First or Second Class Honours degree (or equivalent).
- A strong and genuine commitment to teaching.
- A keen interest in Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

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New Forest Parenting Programme (NFPP) Parent-led intervention for children with, or at risk of ADHD



The New Forest Parenting Program was written by a group of professional psychologists and clinicians and is designed to help parents and carers whose children have ADHD and is an evidence-based program. The course runs internationally as well as across the UK and has a proven track record of helping families.

The programme helps parents to learn about ADHD and how it may affect their child. It helps them to learn the skills needed to promote self-regulation, and reduce inattentiveness, impulsiveness, and difficult behaviours in their children.

Parenting any child can be hard work but parenting a child with ADHD can be additionally challenging. How they learn from their parent is different to how most children learn. Understanding the difference in the brain of a child with ADHD is key to helping parents understand how to adapt their parenting style to help their child. The aim is to help parents become their child's trainer.

A diagnosis of ADHD is not needed to take part in the course. If a diagnosis is in place, the program can be used whether or not a child is receiving medication to treat their ADHD. Upon completion of the full course, parents will receive Certification which will also be recorded with CAMHS in order to assist in accessing the service.

The course is run in school over six 2-hour sessions, two weeks apart for the parents of up to 10 pupils. If you book as a cluster of schools to share costs, we can offer the Springwell School community room as a venue or you can host across your cluster.

Full NFPP Programme cost £1750, including session documentation & refreshments. So, the cost could be divided across your cluster eg. 5 schools, 2 pupils families supported at each school for £350 per school.

The course is run by Jules Wheeler, Higher Level Specialist TA & NFPP Therapist (SIP) and a specialist teaching assistant (SIP). Both of whom have lived experience of Autism and ADHD.

Southampton Neurodiversity Multi-Disciplinary Team (ND MDT)

Meet the Southampton ND MDT, newly formed to deliver the Southampton Young People's Neurodiversity Strategy. This team aims to have oversight of the ND pathway in our city. The team is currently in the first phase and include newly appointed ND Family Engagement Workers. Between us we have many years' experience in supporting children and young people with SEND from 0-19 years. We have worked with children and their families in a wide range of settings and using a multitude of different approaches.

The overarching aims of the Neurodiversity strategy include:

- Develop a needs-led pathway of support across the city.
- Introduce a free online Neurodivergent Profiling Tool to identify and support needs.
- Increase awareness, knowledge and understanding of Neurodivergence amongst settings, young people and their families, and a wide range of relevant professionals.

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SEMH Graduated Approach Online Guide

This Online Analysis Tool is a resource for education settings to use to provide them with information on how to use the Graduated Approach to support pupils with Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH) Difficulties.

The Online Analysis Tool will support settings with identifying areas of strength in their current practice and areas of development. It is hoped that this tool will support settings with ideas of best practice and direction for where to focus for further research and development.

SCC SEND Mainstream Funding Cluster Model

We have 41 settings across the city who are part of the voluntary pilot which started last term and runs until the end of the year. Anonymous feedback on the model from those involved has been overwhelming.

We have allocated £1,000,000 for settings to access across the 2025/2026 financial year as cluster funding requests for either individual students, groups of students or project based requests. There are further benefits of the model that we have seen including the referrals for solution focused discussions, access to expertise (EPs, SEND team, Locality Leads), sharing of best practice and wellbeing checks which have been positively received SENCos and Inclusion Leads who are part of the pilot.

Details of the next stages of the process for the 2025-2026 academic year will soon be sent to all schools.

Be thAT teacher

This course has pathways for Leaders and Classroom teachers. Across three sessions there is a focus on development of Assistive Technology within mainstream school communities.

Be thAT Teaching Assistant

This course is specifically designed to help TAs develop the use of Assistive Technologies to support their work with Neurodivergent Children in mainstream classrooms. The training is built around three 90-minute online group coaching sessions.

We are really excited to announce that both courses could be accessed next academic year for **free** for Southampton Education Settings (5-19). EHCP Quality Assurance Update – Improving EHCP Quality with Invision360



The SEND Team is pleased to share positive developments in our ongoing work to improve the quality of Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs). We've introduced Invision360, a platform used by over 50 local authorities, to support our quality assurance (QA) process. Now two months in, the tool is already helping professionals from education, health, and social care to better understand what makes an effective EHCP and identify areas for improvement.

This is part of a wider QA programme which includes focused training and review cycles to ensure legal compliance and a stronger child and young person (CYP) focus.

We're gradually expanding the number of EHCP auditors and welcome more professionals across the city to get involved. Each volunteer commits to just one 30-minute audit a month. If you're interested in supporting this vital work, please contact Ali Clark at Ali.Clark@southampton.gov.uk.

Portage Training - A small step approach to learning for children with SEND.

This is a two and a half day course and applicants will receive a basic qualification certificate in Portage model of teaching.
